KEY STORYLINES

- The LIV Golf League visits Jeddah for the third consecutive season, with Royal Greens Golf & Country Club becoming the first course to host three LIV Golf tournaments
- Brooks Koepka is the two-time defending Jeddah champion, having won via playoff in each of the previous two years (see info box)
- Koepka's Smash GC, with a revamped lineup that includes reigning LIV Golf Individual Champion Talor Gooch and 2010 U.S. Open winner Graeme McDowell, enter as the latest team winners following their victory at LIV Golf Las Vegas

BROOKS SEEKING 3-PEAT

Smash GC Captain Brooks Koepka is the only repeat winner of a LIV Golf tournament, having won the first two events in Jeddah. A look at those two wins.

2022 Koepka beat his then-Smash teammate Peter Uihlein on the third playoff hole after both players finished regulation at 12 under. It was Koepka's first victory of any kind in 20 months since injuries threatened his career.

Said Koepka: "I didn't know if my career was over for a second. It's nice to be able to come back and be able to win."

Koepka beat Talor Gooch on the second playoff hole after both players finished at 14 under. The win enabled Koepka to move up into the thirdplace bonus-paying position in the Individual Championship standings.

Said Koepka: "I felt like I had to win, and I did my part. Super fortunate to kind of squeak in there."

Gooch, who had wrapped up the season-long Individual Champion title before the playoff, is now a teammate of Koepka's after an off-season trade.

The win was Koepka's first since becoming a firsttime father three months earlier with the birth of his son Crew.

- Johnson is a two-time winner of the PIF Saudi International played at Royal Greens; other LIV Golf members who have won the Saudi International include McDowell, Harold Varner III and Abraham Ancer
- Jon Rahm and his expansion Legion XIII team will make their Jeddah debut as the current leader in the Team Championship standings
- Torque GC Captain Joaquin Niemann, winner of the 2024 season opener in Mayakoba, will make his first LIV Golf start since receiving a special invitation to compete in the 2024 Masters
- Torque GC's Carlos Ortiz enters the tournament fresh off his win Sunday at International Series Oman, with seven other 2024 LIV Golf League regulars also finishing inside the top 10

2009 MASTERS: RECORD 11 BIRDIES

Kim set a tournament record in his Masters debut in 2009 with 11 birdies in the second round en route to shooting a 7-under 65. "To make 11 in one day is pretty special. And obviously to do it at Augusta is amazing," Kim said after his round. "... It feels like a 58 right now."

KIM RETURNS TO PRO GOLF

Anthony Kim, who retired from golf nearly 12 years ago, makes his official return to professional competition this week at LIV Golf Jeddah. Kim joins LIV Golf as a seasonlong Wild Card player.

"After stepping away from the game years ago due to injury, I'm happy to officially announce my return to the world of professional golf," said the 38-year-old Kim. "It's been a long time coming, and I'm very grateful for all the highs, lows and lessons learned from the first part of my career. I want to compete with the best players in the world, and I'm on a mission to prove to myself that I can win again. The next step on that journey starts now, and I'm excited to give everything I've got this season on the LIV Golf League."

"LIV Golf was launched to create new opportunities for players and fans that drive this sport forward in exciting ways, and when I think of Anthony Kim, I can't imagine a more perfect fit for what we're trying to do. His talent is undeniable, and we are thrilled to welcome him back to professional golf with our league," said LIV Golf Commissioner and CEO Greg Norman. "It's clear that he has the fire to win again and show why he was one of the most compelling players in the world, and we will support him on that mission as he works to earn his way back to the top of the game."

Kim will compete in all remaining 2024 LIV Golf regular season tournaments as one of two Wild Card players aiming to accrue points in the league's individual standings and earn a team place in 2025. Kim's joins season-long Wild Card player Hudson Swafford, competing against the LIV Golf League's 13 four-player teams across the 14-event global schedule.

Kim has not played in a professional event since early May of 2012 at the Wells Fargo Championship, when he withdrew after the first round due to tendinitis in his left arm. A month later, he tore the Achilles tendon in his left leg and underwent surgery.

As the LIV Golf League heads into its second full year, adjustments have been made to enhance the drama and build on the world-class fields that compete across the globe.

HOW IT WORKS

TEAM

- Team standings for the regular season will determine the seeds for the season-ending Team Championship
- The top four teams at the end of the regular season receive first-round byes
- Team points are awarded at each regular-season tournament to the top eight finishers

INDIVIDUAL

- Individual points earned throughout the season will be used to calculate the individual standings
- The highest-ranked player following the Individual Championship event will be named the 2024 Individual Champion
- The top three players at the end of the regular season will earn individual bonuses

LOCK ZONE

Players finishing in the top 24 at the end of the Individual Championship secure their 2025 spot in the LIV Golf League

OPEN ZONE





- Royal Greens becomes the first course to host three LIV Golf tournaments, having hosted the regular-season finale in each of the first two seasons
- Royal Greens has hosted professional events multiple times since opening in 2017, including the PIF Saudi International, the flagship event on the Asian Tour
- Every winner of the PIF Saudi International are members of the 2024 LIV Golf League – 4Aces GC Captain Dustin Johnson (winner in 2019 and 2021), Smash GC's Graeme McDowell (winner in 2020), 4Aces GC's Harold Varner III (winner in 2022) and Fireballs GC's Abraham Ancer (winner in 2023)
- Recognized as Saudi Arabia's best golf course by the 2023 World Golf Awards
- The signature hole is the 180-yard par-3 16th located next to the Red Sea

Two-time defending champion **BROOKS KOEPKA**, the Smash GC captain, said his gameplan at Royal Greens is "just stay out of the desert, stay out of the bunkers ... I like this place. What can I say?"



"It's a really good golf course. The way the wind blows here, you have to hit a lot of different shot It asks all the questions. You have to put it in the fairway to hit key shots. But to me it's a big iron-play golf course."


