KEY STORYLINES

- LIV Golf makes its first visit to Tennessee, which becomes the 12th different state to host a LIV Golf tournament
- Five tournaments remain in the regular season that will determine the season-long Individual Champion and seeds for the final 2024 tournament, the Team Championship in Dallas
- Bryson DeChambeau's Crushers GC leads the team standings, while Torque GC Captain Joaquin Niemann is the current individual points leader
- Cleeks GC, captained by two-time major winner Martin Kaymer, won its first LIV Golf team title at the previous tournament in Houston
- Torque's Carlos Ortiz won his first LIV Golf individual title by one stroke over Cleeks newcomer Adrian Meronk in Houston
- The Cleeks are the 10th different team to win a team trophy, while Ortiz is the 17th different individual winner
- Legion XIII Captain Jon Rahm (foot infection) is expected to return to action
- Six LIV Golf players who have qualified for the men's golf competition at the Paris Olympics will be in the field – Spain's Jon Rahm and David Puig, Mexico's Carlos Ortiz and Abraham Ancer, Poland's Adrian Meronk and Chile's Joaquin Niemann.

U.S. OPEN CHAMP BACK IN ACTION

Crushers GC Captain Bryson DeChambeau makes his first LIV Golf start after winning the U.S. Open in epic fashion at Pinehurst with a dramatic 55-yard bunker shot to set up his winning par putt on the final hole.

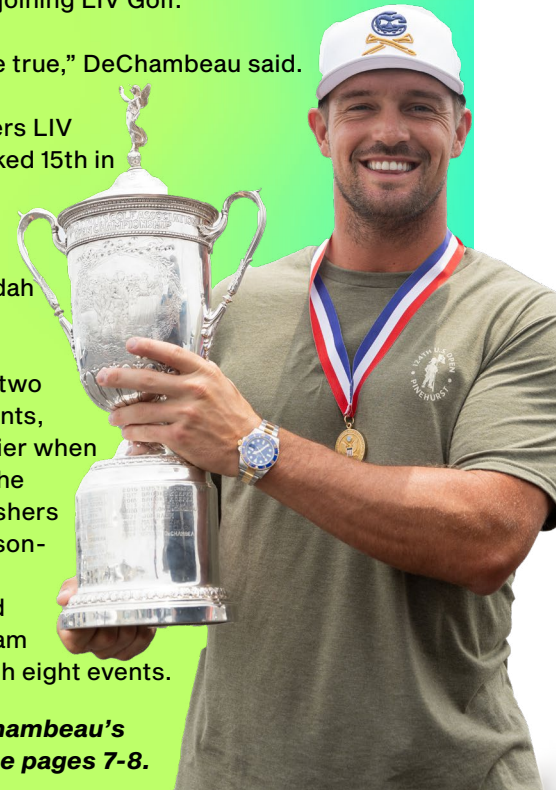
DeChambeau finished at 6 under for the tournament to win by one shot and earn the second U.S. Open victory of his career. He joins Smash GC Captain Brooks Koepka (2023 PGA Champion) as players who have won majors since joining LIV Golf.

"It's a dream come true," DeChambeau said.

DeChambeau enters LIV Golf Nashville ranked 15th in the season-long individual points standings, with a solo fourth in Jeddah as his best finish.

Last year, he won two LIV Golf tournaments, including Greenbrier when he shot 61-58 on the weekend. His Crushers team won the season-ending Team Championship and lead this year's team points race through eight events.

At the core of LIV Golf regular-season tournaments are the simultaneous individual and team competitions that create the sport's most unique competition. As the LIV Golf League heads into its second full year, adjustments have been made to enhance the drama and build on the world-class fields that compete across the globe.

HOW IT WORKS

TEAM

- Team standings for the regular season will determine the seeds for the season-ending Team Championship
- The top three teams at the end of the regular season receive first-round byes
- Team points are awarded at each regular-season tournament to the top eight finishers

INDIVIDUAL

- Individual points earned throughout the season will be used to calculate the individual standings
- The highest-ranked player following the Individual Championship event will be named the 2024 Individual Champion
- The top three players at the end of the regular season will earn individual bonuses

LOCK ZONE

Players finishing in the top 24 at the end of the Individual Championship secure their 2025 spot in the LIV Golf League

OPEN ZONE

Players finishing 25-48 are open to potential trade, release or re-signing by their team

DROP ZONE

Players finishing 49 and below are relegated out of the LIV Golf League and qualify for LIV Golf Promotions

- Designed by LIV Golf CEO and Commissioner Greg Norman, The Grove opened in 2012
- Golf Digest ranks The Grove as one of its top 10 courses in its Best In Tennessee list
- The Grove hosted one of the four Korn Ferry Tour Finals events in 2023, and has also hosted USGA and NCAA tournaments
- The course has been modified from a members' par 72 to a par 71 for LIV Golf Nashville, with the second hole playing as a par 4 at 529 yards, making it the longest par 4 on the course
- The 344-yard par-4 fourth could play as a drivable hole depending on the tee location
- Tees and fairways grass are Zorro Zoysia, while the green is TifEagle Bermuda
- Projected stimpmeter green speed will be between 12.5 to 13

SURRATT RETURNS TO TENNESSEE

LIV Golf's youngest player, 20-year-old Caleb Surratt, returns to his home state this week at LIV Golf Nashville. Born in North Carolina, Surratt played collegiately at the University of Tennessee and remains a Knoxville resident. He turned pro as a teenager before the 2024 LIV Golf season to join Jon Rahm's expansion Legion XIII team. "I'm ecstatic," said Surratt, who won the

2023 SEC Championship as a freshman while earning All-American honors. "It'll be the first time all my friends and family really get to come out and see me." Surratt currently ranks 35th in points, finishing top 15 in each of his first two starts. He also has contributed to Legion XIII's two team victories in Mayakoba and Miami; the team ranks second in the points standings.

2024 U.S. OPEN CHAMP



“I am incredibly grateful and honored to win my second U.S. Open Championship at such an iconic venue. Pinehurst has a rich history in the golfing world, and to have my name etched in its legacy is truly humbling. This win is not just for me, but for everyone who has continued to believe in me along the way.”

Crushers GC Captain Bryson DeChambeau, who joined LIV Golf prior to its first-ever U.S.-based tournament in Portland in 2022, will compete in this week’s LIV Golf Nashville just days after winning his second U.S. Open title with a clutch up-and-down on the 72nd hole at Pinehurst.

The victory continues an impressive string of performances

“All I want to do is entertain and do my best for the game of golf, execute and provide some awesome entertainment for the fans. From at least what I can tell, that’s what the fans want, and they deserve that.”

for DeChambeau in the majors this year while emerging as the sport’s most entertaining golfer.

At the Masters in April, he led after the first round, shared the second-round

lead and eventually finished tied for sixth, his best result at Augusta National.

At the PGA Championship in May, he shot a final-round 64 to finish solo second behind Xander Schauffele by one shot. DeChambeau’s 20-under total would have been good enough to win any previous men’s major.

“When I turned the corner and saw I was a couple back, I said, Nope, I’m not going to let that happen. I have to focus on figuring out how to make this happen. I was a little lucky. Rory didn’t make a couple putts that he could have coming in. I had an amazing up-and-down on the last. I don’t know what else to say. It’s a dream come true.”

And then at the U.S. Open, he entered the final round with a three-shot lead, fell behind Rory McIlroy by two on the back nine, then finished with three gritty pars to finish at 6 under while McIlroy suffered a pair of bogeys down the stretch.

- Becomes the second player after Brooks Koepka (2023 PGA Championship) to win a major after joining LIV Golf

- Becomes the first Northern California native to win the U.S. Open more than once
- Meets eligibility criteria of two major victories for World Golf Hall of Fame consideration (must wait until he’s 45 to be considered)
- Gets custody of the U.S. Open trophy for one year

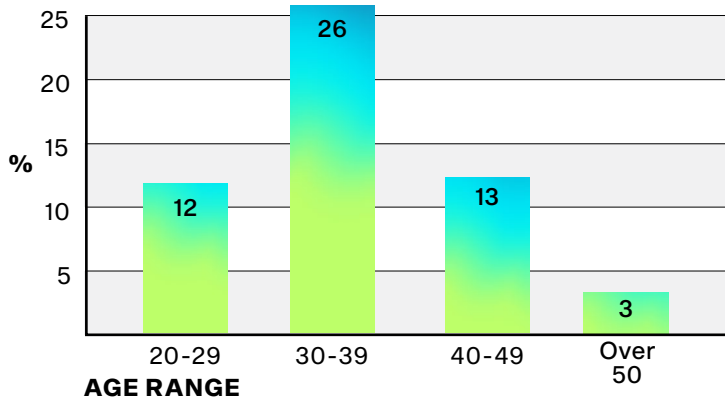
